Group Buy Program

In 2021, Legacy Solar Co-op launched four separate residential and small busine'ss focused Group Buys as one of the strategies we selected to accomplish expanding this revenue stream in 2021.

Highlights

- 222 requests for solar profiles from more than 21 counties in Wisconsin
- 24 signed contracts for a total of more than 173 kW of solar and bringing over \$515,000 in revenue for our installer partners
- Provided valuable data on residential customer preferences and barriers
- Attracted more than one dozen commercial

In 2022, we plan to offer our custom solar report to residential customers statewide as part of our consulting continuum.

Membership Growth

This year Legacy Solar Co-op increased our membership by 14.9%.

For 2022, we plan to expand our membership by 25% through improved outreach and stakeholder networking

S2S Program Development

- Increased monthly subscriptions by 54%
- Retired 164 sRECs, equivalent to 201,702 lbs of CO₂, 400 lbs of NOX and 2,986 mg of mercury
- Worked with 11 organizations on countering the carbon from their business practices, delivery service, and/or conferences.
- Offset Wisconsinite travel both in- and out of state.

In 2022, we are exploring options for growing the program that may include the development of wholesale offset programs.
